A Walk - Paul Mullins

Points range 18-23

From Port Amwlch head E along Coast path for aprox 9Km, Head in land at Porth yrAber to Dulas, S to Traeth Dulas. N towards Tyn Rhos, then W to Parys Mtn. entering old excavations from SW and exiting at Henwaith. Tracks back to Port Amwlch. Some typical Anglesey paths so shinpads recommended. Easy A

Distance: 26Km (16mls)

Ascent: 350 m (1,200 ft)

Walk Points: 18

B Plus Walk – Martin Hayward

Points range 14-18

Starting at Amlwch, heading S, we cross fields to view the open cast copper mines of Parys Mountain. Then E to join the coastal path, passing Penysarn and Nebo. We follow the CP back to Amlwch visiting Point Lynas, if time allows. Good paths throughout. Photos on Facebook.

Distance: 20k (12 miles)

Ascent: 507m (1,663ft)

Walking points 15

B Minus Walk – Ron Owens

Points range 11-14

Leaving Amlwch we pass Carreg-y-Fran and Bod-Ednyfed-fach before crossing the A5025 at Pen-y-lan. Reaching Parys Mountain we navigate the disused pits as we contour the base and achieve the Trig point at 147m by ascending from the SW. We then walk the other side of the mountain for sea views. At the car park we head NW through Parys Farm, Bodgadfa and Pen-Yr-Alt before bearing NW to the coast. We find our way back to Amlwch along a rugged coastal path."

Distance: 17 kms (11 miles)

Ascent: 354m 1,161(ft)

Walk Points: 13

C Walk – Pam McEwan

Points range 7-11

From Amlwch Port we take a minor road heading inland, South, to Carreg-y-Fran where we pick up a series of paths, tracks, and minor roads heading East through beautiful countryside. At Porth Helygen we pick up the coastal path. We follow the path via Freshwater Bay and Point Lynas back to Amlwch Port. Mostly good paths and tracks, a very undulating route throughout with fabulous scenery.

Distance: 14Kms (8.5mls)

Ascent: 335m (1,100ft)

Walk Points: 10.5

D Walk-Andrew Hodgson

Points range 5-7

Starting from the head of Amlwch Port Harbour, we take a there-and-back Anglesey Coastal Path ramble. We will enjoy cliff-top and sea level views, with the sound of breaking waves, enroute E to Porth Eilian, at the base of the Point Lynas peninsula. A firm trodden path undulates over moorland and pasture.

However, some short sections require careful footwork - poles recommended – 1 point extra. No roads, no stiles, and one group of docile cattle. Café adjacent to start. Public toilets may be open, but could close early.

Distance 8 kms (5 miles)

Ascent 75 m (200ft)

Walk points 6
